

MuMETAL® STRESS ANNEALED SHEET

DESCRIPTION

MuMETAL® is a non-oriented 80% nickel-iron-molybdenum alloy which offers a saturation induction of about 0.75T (7500 G), low coercive forces, and extremely high initial permeability as well as maximum permeability with minimum hysteresis losses. MuMetal is used in high quality magnetic shielding, current sensors, high precision current transformer cores, and ground fault circuit breaker (relay parts).
